Michael Crino has worked for 20 years in support of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) programs and is currently the Deputy Director of USAID's GeoCenter. In

this role, Michael oversees how geographic analysis strengthens USAID's development programs and assesses emerging and novel geospatial technologies to help the Agency maximize the impact of its work in support of developing countries. Prior to joining USAID, Michael managed mapping and GIS projects in support of major transportation, infrastructure, and environmental projects. Most notably, he oversaw a program to map the entire New York City Sewer System, one of the largest civilian GIS programs ever undertaken at the time of its implementation. Michael has presented at the World Bank and many U.S. and international forums on the application of geospatial technology for development, humanitarian assistance, and infrastructure. Michael is a Lieutenant Commander in the US Navy Reserve and was deployed to Iraq with the II Marine Expeditionary Force in 2008 and 2009.
